



## FOOD WASTE

- Food waste, raw and cooked.
- Fruits and vegetables.
- Egg and nut shells.
- Kitchen paper and napkins.
- Coffee grounds and filters, tea bags.

**Put the waste in a green bag - tie with a knot.**



## GENERAL WASTE

- Contaminated packaging.
- Gift wrapping paper and ribbon.
- Dirty pizza boxes.
- Vacuum cleaning bags.
- Sanitary towels and nappies.

**Put the waste in a bag - tie with a knot.**



## GLASS

- Glass bottles from spirits, dressing and fruit juice.
- Marmalade/jam glasses.
- Empty food jars.
- Wine bottles.

**Place empty glass and bottles loose in the container.**



## METAL

- Tins from beer and soft drinks.
- Food tins.
- Aluminum trays and foil.
- Used tea light holders, bottle tops and metal lids.

**Place the empty packaging loose in the container.**



## CARDBOARD

- Small cardboard boxes.
- Thin cardboard packaging.
- Corrugated cardboard.
- Shoe boxes.
- Egg boxes.

**Must be clean and dry. Place loose in the container.**



## PAPER

- Newspapers and magazines.
- Brochures.
- Writing paper.
- Letters and envelopes.

**Must be clean and dry. Place loose in the container.**



## PLASTIC

- Plastic trays from cakes, fruit and vegetables.
- Plastic foil e.g. carrier bags, freezer bags.
- Plastic containers from e.g. vinegar, ice cream, shampoo.

**Put the empty packaging loose in the container.**



## FOOD- & DRINK CARTONS

- Empty milk and juice cartons.
- Empty food cartons i.e. from soup, yoghurt, cream and ice cream.

**Put the empty packaging loose in the container.**



## TEXTILE WASTE

- Worn clothes.
- Worn bedding.
- Worn towels.
- Worn tea towels.

**Place the textile waste in a closed clear bag. It must be dry.**



## HAZARDOUS WASTE

- Paint and oil residues.
- Batteries.
- Spray bottles.
- Chemicals.
- Light bulbs.

**Place the hazardous waste in the red environment box.**
